BACKGROUND

WHAT IS THE OBJECTIVE?

- To briefly report the best practices (with case-studies) on Small Scale Fisheries governance from 2 renown Mediterranean-based projects:
 - "Transforming Mediterranean Small-Scale fisheries": led by WWF Marine Initiative, the project is establishing a "Co-management for small-scale fisheries" system (i.e. a collaborative and participative process of regulatory decision making, where decision-related power is equally distributed among the different actors) in 24 pilot sites from 10 Med countries
 - "FishMPABlue2": led by Federparchi Europarc Italy, the project tested 12 actual measures of SSF governance and management in 11 pilot MPAs from 6 Med countries, results are described in detail within the "Governance toolkit for small-scale fisheries (SSF)"
- Stimulate a quick "peer review" of strengths and room for improvements on the showcased best practices

WHY SHOULD I ATTEND?

If you are an artisanal fisher, if you work with/for artisanal fisher (e.g. in a Port Authority, in a FLAG, etc.), if you have to manage SSF within your territory (e.g. an MPA, a FRA, etc.), if you have to plan SSF fishing effort/gears/etc. (e.g. as a Port Authority), if you deal with SSF policy making (e.g. as a Province, a Ministry, an International organization), you can learn from SSF governance-related approaches and tools that have been tested in the last years by this 2 projects in dozen of Mediterranean MPAs, and add your own experience to the discussion in order to improve such a best practices.

WHO IS ORGANIZING IT?

The Interreg MED-funded "Mediterranean Biodiversity Protection Community" project, led by ETC-UMA. The CPMR and its Intermediterranean Commission are coordinating the Working Group n.2, supported by Mr. Luca Santarossa as external expert.
